### **Teaching and Research**

I am the Program Director for the GI fellowship training program at UCSF and I co-direct the UCSF medical student block (Metabolism and Nutrition Block, IDS 106), during which the UCSF medical students are taught the fundamentals of clinical gastroenterology and hepatology.

My research interests are related to clinical and translational research in the areas of colorectal cancer prevention, especially among individuals at high risk for cancer, such as those with hereditary cancer syndromes or those with longstanding inflammatory bowel disease. Particular areas of interest include the optimal provision of genetic counseling and testing, cancer risk factor identification and risk mitigation by interventions such as drugs (chemoprevention) and colonoscopy. I also study the use of genetic and genomic markers to determine cancer risk and prognosis and prediction of response to therapy among those already diagnosed with cancer. I also am interested in projects related to biomarkers of prognosis and prediction of response to therapies in patients with inflammatory bowel disease.
